

## Editorial:


**MEET CHIEF TEEHEEZEL (1883 to 1939)**

**A CHALLENGING TOPIC**


A well known and somewhat popular topic among philatelist is one where a postage stamp is featured on a Poster Stamp. We have presented some of these in our auctions in the past. What is unusual, however, is a Poster Stamp that features another Poster Stamp. We have found two and there may be more.



### A ROMANTIC INVENTION

In 1907 Ole Evinrude, an immigrant from Oslo, Norway, developed the first outboard motor boat engine in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He was inspired to do so by an event that took place on the banks of Lake Okauchee near Milwaukee, in 1906. He took Bessie Cary for a picnic across the lake in a row boat. After they landed about one and a half miles from the far shore, Bessie expressed a desire for a dish of ice cream. The gallant Ole, anxious to please her, rowed across the lake to bring his love a dish of ice cream. Of course, it had turned to warm soup by the time he rowed back to her. It was at this time that Ole determined to invent an outboard motor that would replace the oar. Shortly after that picnic Ole married Bessie Cary. Then, in 1909, Ole designed a 1.5 hp detachable out board engine that could be mounted on the back of a row boat. It was an instant success when it was first introduced to the public. As the following sheet of 12 illustrates, Evinruding now goes on all over the world. Oh, happy day!









SAD NEWS













